## **Staffing**

#### Parks Canada (federal):

- One full-time permanent staff member is exclusively dedicated to maintenance at Grand-Pré National Historic Site. Term maintenance employees are added during the busiest times of the year.
- The New Brunswick North Field Unit provides professional expertise in managing assets, cultural resources, visitor experiences and services, interpretation programs, and ecological protection programs.
- The Atlantic Service Centre provides technical services in planning, archaeology, curation and conservation, historical research, environmental impact assessments, landscape architecture, social sciences, design, geographic information systems (GIS), cartography, and asset management.

# Dept. of Communities, Culture and Heritage – Heritage Division (provincial):

 Archaeologists, conservators, curators and heritage managers are available to provide the required professional and technical expertise.

#### Department of Agriculture (provincial)

- An Aboiteau Superintendent, engineers, and asset managers help protect the dykes.
- Other divisions include staff who can provide support for marketing, business sustainability, and product promotion.

### The County of Kings (municipal)

 Planners, GIS specialists, engineers, and emergency management officers have various responsibilities in managing and providing information for reporting purposes.

## Société Promotion Grand-Pré (community)

- A staff of three people is responsible for ongoing operations of the Société, whose primary mandate is to promote Grand Pré and operate the visitor services.
- Summer staff comprise two interpreters, seven actors, two sales clerks for the gift shop, and one project coordinator.

#### **Grand Pré Marsh Body**

 The approximately 30 landowners who are the marsh body's members are the best experts available for understanding and managing the dykelands. Many farmers are from families who have lived and worked on the dykes for close to 10 generations.
